The successful candidate will have a strong record of publications in one or more areas of systematic theology and an active research agenda, as well as a record of teaching excellence and mentoring experience at both graduate and undergraduate levels. Responsibilities include teaching two courses each semester. In addition to teaching one of the two courses required for all undergraduates, faculty members have opportunities to teach more specialized courses for Theology majors, required or elective courses at the master's (MTS/MDiv) level, and doctoral seminars. The successful candidate will be sympathetic to the mission of the University of Notre Dame, which seeks a distinctive educational and scholarly excellence that is founded on its Catholic identity, and to the contribution of the Theology Department within that larger vision.
