

## **Thomistic Studies Position**

The Department of Theology at the University of Notre Dame invites applications for a full-time tenure-track professorship in medieval scholastic theology, with a focus on Thomas Aquinas, at the assistant professor rank. The starting date for this position will be August 26, 2024. The successful candidate will show evidence of strong scholarship and a trajectory toward a field-leading contribution to the study of the theology of Thomas Aquinas in its historical context. The faculty member will be expected to participate fully in the academic life of the Department of Theology and to collaborate with colleagues at the Notre Dame Medieval Institute. Responsibilities will include teaching and mentoring students at all levels- doctoral (and pre-doctoral), ministerial, and undergraduate. The successful candidate will also be sympathetic to the mission of the University of Notre Dame, which seeks a distinctive educational and scholarly excellence that is founded on its Catholic identity, and to the contribution of the Theology Department within that larger vision.
